


Ken Leonczyk



Political Point-Counterpoint: The State of Health Care and Politics

Part journalist, part historian, and all shrewd political observer, Ron Brownstein explains the complexities of American politics with lucid precision. As editorial director of strategic partnerships for Atlantic Media Company, editorial director of National Journal, and a senior political and election analyst for CNN, he produces sharp analysis on health care, politics, policy, the electorate, media, and a range of other issues informed by his strong sense of American political and national history. He's also been a finalist for the Pulitzer Price twice, cited for the "clarity, consistency, and quality of his political reporting."

DISTINGUISHED SPEAKERS



Dr. Tom Coburn Former us senator, oklahoma

The Honorable Tom Coburn is a physician, former US senator for Oklahoma, and two-time cancer survivor, who's been described by newspapers as a budget hawk dedicated to reducing wasteful Washington spending, increasing accountability and transparency for all taxpayers, and making health care more affordable and accessible for all Americans. Senator Coburn was a member of the Committee on Commerce where he sat on the subcommittees on Health and Environment, Energy and Power, and Oversight and Investigations. Near the end of 2001, Senator Coburn was chosen to be cochair of the President's Advisory Council on HIV and AIDS.

Senator Coburn was one of the primary authors of the Patients' Choice Act introduced in 2009. His goal was to introduce health care reform legislation that delivered on the shared principles of promoting universal access to quality, affordable health care without adding new debt or taxes. The Patients Choice Act was one of several proposals by the Republicans and a precursor to the most recent American Health Care Act introduced in 2017.



Wendy Davis former state senator, texas

The Honorable Wendy Davis is a former Texas state senator and former candidate for governor of Texas. Ms. Davis has a reputation for tirelessly fighting for reproductive rights, equal pay for women, justice for sexual assault survivors, affordable quality education, and equality for the LGBTQ community. An attorney by trade, Ms. Davis's public service career spans three decades. She's recognized for her 13-hour filibuster on the floor of the Texas Senate to defeat a legislative effort to dramatically reduce women's access to abortion care in 2013.

Noted for her talents as a legislative leader, in 2009 she was named the Texas legislature's Rookie of the Year by Texas Monthly magazine and Freshman of the Year by the AARP. Ms. Davis was named to Texas Monthly's Top Ten Best Legislators in 2013 and has received numerous awards, including the Texas Women's Health Champion Award from the Texas District (XI) of The American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists. She's also the founder of Deeds Not Words, an advocacy initiative that empowers millennial women to channel their passion and energy on gender equality issues into actionable change. Ms. Davis graduated first in her class from Texas Christian University before graduating with honors from Harvard Law School. She was the first person in her family to attend and graduate from college.



Dr. Sanjay Gupta is the multiple Emmy® award-winning chief medical correspondent for CNN. Dr. Gupta, a practicing neurosurgeon, plays an integral role in CNN's reporting on health and medical news for all of CNN's shows domestically and internationally and contributes to CNN.com. His medical training and public health policy experience distinguishes his reporting from war zones and natural disasters as well as on a range of medical and scientific topics—including health care reform, the Ebola outbreak, brain injury, disaster recovery, fitness, military medicine, and HIV and AIDS. Additionally, Dr. Gupta is the host of Vital Signs for CNN International and Accent Health for Turner Private Networks. He's received many awards, including the Laureate Award for leaders in health and wellness by John F. Kennedy University.


